

Modern Foreign Language Progressive Pathway

Learning a foreign language supports our understanding of our multicultural society as well as:

- Providing an opening to other cultures
- Fostering students' curiosity
- Deepening students' understanding of the world.

Students get an opportunity to explore a range of three different languages throughout the two years of Key Stage 2 which support a range of Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education for France, Spanish and Poland.

Students will learn how to

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.
- Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.
- Speak in short sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.

- Present ideas and information orally to a small group.
- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.
- Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.
- Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary.
- Write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly.
- Describe people, places, things and actions orally* and in writing.
