We are delighted to welcome you to Elmley Dray School, a place where students are supported and celebrated for their unique strengths. Our dedicated team of staff, alongside supportive families, creates a nurturing environment where every child is encouraged to grow, learn, and reach their full potential.

Our school puts children and young people's rights at the heart of all decisions about their education, health and care in order to improve wellbeing and develop every child's talents and abilities to their full potential.

The school aims to ensure future engagement and inclusion within education, further education, employment, training and/or the community through emotional intelligence, therapeutic support and a caring and supporting learning environment, which will bridge the gap created by barriers to previous learning and engagement with education.

Admissions

We welcome students to Elmley Dray School who have an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP)

- A diagnosis of ASC
- Have evidence of Autistic Traits
- Are recognised as having an Anxiety Disorder
- Sensory issues which means they need a specialist environment
- FASD
- SEMH with an Autism diagnosis or evidence of Autistic Traits
- Working within three years of their current year group due to a lack of school attendance

When you have an EHCP, Elmley Dray School needs to be consulted with by the local authority for possible admission to the school to proceed.

- Help with communication skills through a variety of teaching and therapy approaches
- Students own learning styles considered in planning
- Understanding and discussions around personal targets

Curriculum and Learning

At The Elmley Dray School we aim to provide an engaging and exciting curriculum which is built on the foundations of promoting good levels of attendance and engagement and the holistic delivery of therapies and emotional intelligence. The curriculum has a clear approach to the development of both spoken and written language for children who are identified with speech, language and communication difficulties.

We aim to engage our students in deep learning experiences across the curriculum through a clear progression of skills and knowledge coupled with strong links across curriculum subjects and varied learning experiences through enrichment opportunities.

We have a clear approach to the teaching and learning of core subjects, which we identify as English, Mathematics, Science, ICT, Personal and Social Development with the intent to support student well-being and provide children with life skills that will help them when they move onto their Key Stage 4 studies towards accreditation. We are very lucky to have a learning outside the classroom area and access to a modern kitchen for teaching cookery for health and wellbeing.

Implementation of the curriculum is driven through clear two year rolling progressive pathways which are designed to motivate, engage and challenge students to achieve. Clear feedback will show learners what they have done well and indeed what could be better. Students are encouraged to assess their own progress within lessons as well as contribute to the assessment of class achievements.

At The Elmley Dray School, we believe in the importance of both a traditional academic curriculum, that gives students the essential knowledge they need to be educated citizens, and a curriculum that promotes our values. By focusing on these principles, our students are fully prepared for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences needed to gain qualifications, supporting students to think independently, creatively and holistically and thereby enrich their later lives.

The balanced and broad curriculum we offer is designed to ensure the incremental development of both knowledge and skills. But, at the heart of our curriculum is a clear focus on the core knowledge, (which centres on literacy, numeracy and reading skills), needed by all students, no matter what their personal barriers, to make good progress.

CEIAG - Careers

Students in KS3 - KS5 have CEIAG embedded into all subjects on their timetable, as well as dedicated careers preparation sessions.

Careers education is more focused on preparing students for life after school, as well as providing them with and helping them to explore post 16 options such as continuing at school or college, apprenticeships or vocational training.

Students will also be exposed to and allowed to explore career pathways and the skills required in different fields across the curriculum, whilst being supported to make informed decisions about future education and employment opportunities. They will be given information and encouraged to carry out research to explore the full range of options available as well as receiving one - to - one meetings in line with the updated Gatsby Benchmarks.

Elmley Dray works closely with local providers and organisations in the community to support young people with work experience and voluntary placements.

RSE Curriculum

At Elmley Dray School, we teach Relationships Education and Health Education to all pupils as part of our statutory curriculum through SPHERE lessons. These subjects are compulsory, and parents/carers do not have the right to withdraw their child from them. This includes lessons on friendships, families, respect, safety (both online and offline), mental wellbeing, and the physical and emotional changes of puberty.

We also teach Sex Education in addition to the science curriculum. Parents/carers have the right to request that their child be withdrawn from some or all of these specific sex education lessons. This right does not apply to lessons which are part of the National Curriculum for Science, where pupils learn about the biological aspects of human growth and reproduction, which all pupils must attend.

If you would like to discuss withdrawing your child from non-statutory sex education, please contact the headteacher in writing. We will invite you to a meeting to talk through the request, explain what is taught, and ensure you are fully informed before making a final decision.

Student Support and Wellbeing

At Elmley Dray, we prioritise the wellbeing of every child. Our team is here to support students both academically and emotionally, creating an environment where they feel safe, valued, and respected. We have a dedicated wellbeing room, sensory room, regulation zones and wellbeing staff.

Personalised Learning and Individual Study Programmes

Elmley Dray School has created an educational system with personalised learning at its heart. Within this system, every child matters, and every child/young person is seen as an individual. Attention is given to the learning styles, motivations and needs. There is target setting linked to good quality formative assessments and marking.

The personalised learning programmes within the school, give every single learner, the chance to be the best they can be, whatever their talents or background. It's our commitment to excellence in education which will provide every child with the confidence to learn, and the pathway to success for life.

Uniform

There is no set uniform, students are required to wear clothes that are comfortable and appropriate for the learning activity. The school will communicate with parents and carers on the appropriate clothing required for learning outside the classroom activities.

Active Listening Culture

Legislation now highlights the importance of young learners' participation and consultation. Elmley Dray CIC and School recognises that the 'voice' of the learner is now enshrined in legislation with respect to the rights of young people to be heard and considered through a process of participation and collaboration. The Elmley Dray School exists to support the personal and academic development of learners, and listening to the views of both tutors and learners will enable the educational provision to move forward in a dynamic and innovative way meeting the ever changing demands placed upon the community.

Elmley Dray CIC and School values all learners within their learning community and the contributions they make.

Assessment

All assessment is linked to end of year teacher tests, Entry Level and GCSE level indicators and will be provided at the end of each academic year within a short report. Further assessment information will be available within the Annual and Interim Review processes. The School utilises CAT4, White Rose and Purple Mash assessments.

Extracurricular Activities

We offer a wide range of extracurricular activities to enhance students' learning experiences and encourage personal development. Some of our offerings include:

We believe these activities help students build confidence, develop new skills, and make lasting friendships.

Learning Outside the Classroom

The school believes in the value of nature and the outside environment in supporting the learning and wellbeing of our learners. Therefore, courses in gardening are going to be promoted on site initially and with Minster Leas on our doorstep, we will be using the facilities of the area to promote health and wellbeing as well as team working and problem solving within the community.

Communication with Parents and Carers

We believe that strong communication between school and home is key to student success. There are several ways you can stay informed about your child's progress:

- Parent-Teacher Meetings: We hold regular parent-teacher meetings to discuss your child's progress, goals, and any concerns.
